#### **USING YOUR SENSES**

In this booklet there are lots of suggestions for things to do to engage your senses, but don't feel you have to complete the whole booklet. Take your time, bring it back with you another time to finish, or miss parts out that don't appeal to you. The most important thing is that you have lots of fun as you explore Leeds Castle!

Look out for these symbols in the booklet:



These highlight which senses you are focussing on. Throughout this booklet you will be encouraged to use four of your five senses – sound, smell, sight and touch.

Some of the suggestions involve touching plants and trees around the grounds of Leeds Castle. Please be gentle and do not pick any leaves or flowers from them



#### THE WOODLAND WALK



Stand by the first lake you come to. Lots of our ducks, geese and swans live here, and there are lots of birds living in the trees in this area.

All of them make different noises. How many different quacks, tweets and honks can you hear?





As you walk through the gardens, look for 3 different leaves on the ground to collect.

Do you know which trees they are from?




How could you describe their texture? Are they crunchy or soft?

Are all of your leaves the same colour? Which one is your favourite?



#### THE WALK







Can you find any conkers on the ground? Can you also find one of their spiky shells? How do they each feel in your hand?







Find a bench to sit on and close your eyes.

- What can you hear?
- What can you smell?
- Can you feel a breeze on your face?
- Is it warm or cold?



Did you know that you can smell a lot more in the air on a warm, wet day than a cold, dry one? What is the weather like today? Has it been raining recently? Can you smell the trees and plants around you?





#### THE GREAT WATER





How many autumn colours can you see around the edge of the lake?

If any birds are swimming on the lake, watch the ripples they leave behind them in the water.



What else can you see around the lake? Try to spot something small that most people wouldn't notice.



Can you hear the water fowl again? If you are lucky enough to see swans or geese in flight, can you hear their wings as they fly?






#### INSIDE THE CASTLE

These ideas will keep your senses active if you go inside Leeds Castle today.






In the Servants Quarters have a look up at the ceiling. What a lovely pattern!




#### THE MAZE

When you reach the middle, stand at the top and have a look around. What sights can you see?






Close your eyes. What sounds can you hear from this high spot?
